Our lawyer advises that we should proceed with a Class Action Suit against certain mining promoters (BPU, SAN and IMT) and the BC Government with a claim for probable property loss due to forecast uranium mining in the Kettle River watershed. This lawsuit could evolve into a Charter Challenge about Property Rights.

We will proceed with establishing a data base of facts regarding the owner names and assessed value of all properties which derive their water from the Kettle River aquifer, south of the potential pollution source from the Blizzard/ Cup-Donen uranium mining claims. This area extends southward (downstream) from Trapping Creek on the West Kettle eastwards to Damfino Creek on the main Kettle River and thence southwards to the US border at Midway, B.C.

We request all supporting landowners to forward their names, addresses and 2008 Land Assessment figures to the CCKV researcher at tester13@direct.ca

The probable total assessed value of such affected property will be at least 650 million dollars.

The Assessed value of all of these properties is publicly available but we hope that all threatened land owners will voluntarily provide this information to the CCKV research team as a show of support for our legal action which will protect us all from the threat to our health and to financial loss. Should the Kettle River become polluted by uranium mining we are of the opinion that all property owners will suffer loss of property value by from 30% to 80% as a result.

Please do this quickly as we wish to file this lawsuit before the forthcoming provincial election.
